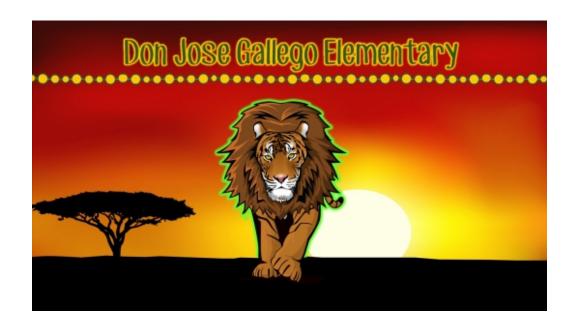

Jose Gallego Elementary School is a data-driven, student-centered school whose shared mission is to provide students with the experiences, skills, materials and resources necessary to promote academic growth. We implement the RTI process and monitor student progress every three weeks while providing needed tutorials, intervention and reinforcement through the use of campus/district approved instructional programs, campus tutorials, extended days, and Super Saturdays. Student achievement is rewarded through recognition ceremonies such as STUDENT OF THE MONTH, PERFECT ATTENDANCE and AR. Goal Setting sessions with classroom teachers, counselor and self-monitoring of student progress. Data room, Data walls and individual student progress tracking folder for CBA's and Benchmarks per student. Administration, Faculty, Staff, Students and Parents monitoring student progress to ensure academic success. PASS (Parents-Administration-Staff-Students) for student success.

#### **Student Academic Achievement Strengths**

At Jose Gallego Elementary School the focus is on Student Progress Measure and Student Improvement for our student subgroups: ELL, SpEd, 504 & Dyslexia. We identify at-risk students and target their weaknesses and provide support and mentorship through Special Education tutors, M&M mentoring program, RTI consistent progress monitoring and positive reinforcement for continued student success and academic growth. After CBA/Benchmark, data is analyzed and teachers, support staff and administration create an action plan for continued intervention/remediation. Students' weaknesses are identified and addressed accordingly. Students are held accountable for their learning. 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students sign a contract with the Counselor to attend tutorials and excel in the classroom and on state assessments. In order to develop habits of continuous improvement, our staff stays focused, informed, trained and aware of the expectations, accountability standards and district/campus goals.

Campus administration monitors instruction on a daily basis to ensure alignment between curriculum, instructiona and assessments. Students are assessed with locally developed assessments every six weeks to monitor student performance and provide interventions accordingly.

The school provides a variety of activities and opportunities for students to learn inleuding college career readiness, advanced placement, extended learning time, Robotics, Weird Science activities, etc.
